Testimonies	<p>We grew up on opposite sides of the world in contrasting cultures and with unique religious experiences. In both stories, we found God to be real, powerful, and loving.</p> <p>Titus: I lived a life of many sins until I met Christ as a teenager. I was the only Christian in my family, and my parents persecuted me a lot. They threatened to kick me out of the house and not support me financially to go to school. They did not like the “new me.” But I testified to them that my life was completely changed by the blood of Jesus Christ. When I became a Christian, I stopped doing all my sinful habits: drinking alcohol, stealing, and gambling. Every day I live as a new creation—as God has created me to be—and an example to my family. After I became a Christian, my pastor advertised a local Bible college. I prayed for six months before I responded to God’s call. During and after graduating in 2003, I helped establish several churches. While studying and pastoring in the rural villages, I felt God calling me to plant an urban church among the educated and wealthy, but God never opened the way until now.</p> <p>Jewel: I accepted Christ at a very young age, but did not fully comprehend His goodness until almost ten years later. It was around age 13 that I fully committed myself to be a disciple of Christ. I always tried to do the right things, but soon I realized that being a Christian is so much more. I began taking my first steps toward being a wholehearted Christian, and I committed myself to reflect the fruits of the Spirit and to read His Word, memorize it, and apply it to my life. My heart for God and His people grew bigger until my only desire became to serve God and His people in full-time ministry.</p> <p>Cambodia is a land full of people who have no hope—people plagued by poverty, sickness, and 40-year-old memories and scars of the Khmer Rouge. The Lord has laid Isaiah 61:1-3 on our hearts, and it is the message and the ministry that we will take with us to the people of Cambodia. Our call is to expand God’s kingdom in Cambodia by evangelizing and discipling the educated and wealthy and ministering wholistically to the younger generations by means of community development and compassionate ministries.</p>
