

# **"40 by 40"** TRAIN 40 AFRICAN OB/GYN RESIDENTS BY 2040

In Kenya, and throughout much of Africa, all vaginal births are conducted by midwives with various training and no pain control options. Maternal & perinatal mortalities are unacceptably high. Increasing the number of trained OB/GYN physicians will improve health outcomes for women and their babies. (Kenyan Maternal Mortality Rates are 21 times higher than in the USA)

Tenwek Mission Hospital has a 67-bed maternity ward, which is often fully occupied, 2-3 women sharing a bed. Some common OB/GYN conditions treated at Tenwek include: intrauterine fetal demise, miscarriages, severe pre-eclampsia, advanced cervical cancers in 20-40-year-olds, illegal abortion complications, severe anemias, massive fibroids and ovarian tumors – with many of these conditions compounded by multiple co-morbidities.







While some OB/GYN residency programs are offered elsewhere in Kenya, they are typically academically oriented and distantly supervised by an attending physician. **Tenwek's OB/GYN Residency program will be the first Christian OB training program in Africa**, clinically oriented and positioned to recruit physicians with a passion for using their skills in ministry and treating underserved communities.



The addition of an OB/GYN Residency at Tenwek Hospital will require additional equipment for training and treatment. Your gift – of any size – is important, welcome, and will have impact! Our Missionary Medical faculty are self funded.
